Dear LBP Family and Friends,

I couldn't be happier to be able to welcome you to our 51st production of The Nutcracker. Through determination, commitment and a lot of hard work our dancers, volunteers and teachers are able to bring this wonderful production to life even during these unprecedented times. Faced with the challenges of a global pandemic, I was uncertain if we'd be able to produce Nutcracker 2020. Dancers and teachers have spent countless hours creating and learning dances in person and via Zoom to make this very special production the best it can be. Thank you to our parents who have shuffled dancers to in-person rehearsals, logged onto virtual rehearsals and cleared out kitchens, bedrooms, basements and garages to create rehearsal space. Thank you to our incredible volunteers, who not only were charged with production responsibilities, but worked tirelessly on creating COVID safety protocols to keep our dancers, teachers and volunteers safe.

I am overwhelmingly grateful to everyone who is part of our LBP family. Thank you does not begin to express the depth of my appreciation. This Nutcracker season has provided a true example of our studio's resilience and embodiment of the word "family". We have worked together to make sure that our dancers continue to have access to a safe outlet to continue to pursue their passion. The studio has put in place numerous policies and procedures to keep everyone healthy, both at the studio and throughout this performance weekend. We used our learnings from our summer recital and Romeo and Juliet as the foundation for this weekend's Nutcracker safety plan. We will continue to work nonstop to make it the safest experience possible for everyone.

As you watch today, you will notice some differences from our normal productions. There will be smaller groups with less people on the stage during each Act. Physical interactions and touching have been modified, when possible, to ensure everyone's safety. All dancers have sanitized their hands before and after dancing so those dancers who must touch are safe. The biggest visual difference will be masks worn by the groups. While we will miss seeing our dancer's bright smiles, we will still see the joy in their faces and feel their smiles but will feel comforted that we are keeping them safe.

Finally, I am overjoyed that we are able to do this Nutcracker for our students. With remote learning and COVID closures, dance has become much more important in our students' lives and important for their physical and mental wellbeing. Dance is a tremendous outlet for the dancers to work through their emotions by leaving it all out on the floor. I think this is especially true now as our students have so much more weighing on them during this global pandemic. As a teacher, seeing my students each week, in person or virtually, has helped ground me and gives me a sense of normal life despite our challenges. I am grateful to have the chance to be part of a break from the day to day restrictions they are experiencing. It is always emotional to see our seniors dance at their last Nutcracker and I'm so glad we are able to celebrate them this way.

I am thrilled to be bringing The Nutcracker live to our audience near and far. So, without further ado, please sit back, relax and enjoy this special performance.




